## THERE'S AN OPENING FOR PARTY OF REALITY

Here they come, the newly resurgent Democrats, ready to take on "the man" (Rep. Rashida Tlaib); protect America's middle class from "attack" by big corporations and billionaires (Sen. Elizabeth Warren); provide "Medicare for All" (Sen. Kamala Harris); offer universal pre-K (Julian Castro); and fight capitalism in general without any idea of how it works (Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez). The Democratic Party is lurching to the left like a confused American driver on a British highway.

Democratic voters are becoming more liberal, too. In the past 17 years, Pew research has found, the percentage of Democrats who described themselves as liberal jumped from 30 to 50 percent. This is reflected in issue positions. In 2008, the percentage of Democrats who agreed that immigrants here illegally should be permitted to become citizens was 29 percent. That increased to 51 percent in 2018. Between 2010 and 2017, the portion who said "racial discrimination is the main reason many blacks can't get ahead these days" rose from 28 percent to 64 percent.

The liberal nostrums on offer are utterly disconnected from the actual challenges the nation faces. It's hard to see how the "war on the middle class" theme can get traction in an economy with 3.9 percent unemployment. Poverty has been declining and middle incomes have been increasing since 2013. U.S. median household size, meanwhile, has declined, so individual wealth has increased even more than the income numbers reflect.

Admittedly, facts need not impede a good political pitch. Republicans have succeeded by offering their own fractured fairy tale about what ails the nation. They've insisted that we are being overrun by illegal immigrants, when border apprehensions are at an 18-year low. They assert that immigrants bring crime, which is false. They've claimed (along with some progressives like Bernie Sanders) that outsourcing has decimated U.S. manufacturing, when the real story is that automation has been the chief cause of lost manufacturing jobs. And they've claimed that globalization has hollowed out the middle class when, in truth, global trade, while costing some jobs, has created far more and provided middle income Americans with a bounty of affordable products, thus improving their standard of living.

Republicans and Democrats alike encourage victimhood. We need a party that will address the true problems we face.

As a governing matter, our greatest problem is that we are not behaving like citizens but like consumers. We are gorging on entitlements and washing them down with tax cuts. The bill? What bill? We can always borrow more! Medicare's trust fund runs out in seven years. Social Security's in 15.

Also, we are living in a civic cesspool. Our language, our manners and our hatreds are out of control and out of proportion to our problems. We are marinating in mutual contempt and suckers for conspiracy theories.

It's not that our problems are so intractable; it's that our spirits are so sour. We desperately need some uplift, some commitment to the rule of law, more suspicion of centralized power, and a stab at trust. It's a lot to ask of a political party, and frankly, most of our problems, like the decline of families and churches, are pre-political. But leadership is important, and the majority of Americans are not at the extremes.

## PRESIDENT TRUMP HELPS AMERICAN POOR THROUGH CAPITALISM

According to Star Parker, founder of the Center for Urban Renewal and Education, President Donald Trump is using capitalism quite effectively to help America's poorest citizens. Parker believes Trump's policies are helping low-income Americans who have not previously been participating in the nation's economic prosperity.

With unemployment at historic lows, Parker is excited over Trump's executive order to establish the White House Opportunity and Revitalization Council to implement Opportunity Zones previously created in the 2017 tax bill.

Opportunity Zones are designated areas within all 50 states, the District of Columbia, and five U.S. territories where poverty often stands at twice the national average. Private investors in these zones will receive preferred tax treatment, thereby encouraging economic growth.

During remarks at the White house signing ceremony for this executive order, billionaire BET network founder Bob Johnson said the president's new tax programs "will cause people to invest money where before they saw risk, now they will see opportunity. And that combination of putting money into communities will allow for those communities to become vibrant, to become safe, to create ownership, and, most important, to contribute to the well-being of this country."

## AIR HEADS

New Zealand prides itself on being the "clean, green" capital of the world. Its Ministry of the Environment even published a report titled "Our Clean Green Image: What's It Worth?" It claims that "people want to eat what we produce, experience our unspoilt environment." No surprise, then, that a New Zealand company is selling its . . . air. And it ain't cheap. As reported by *The New York Post*, a four-pack of duty-free cans by Kiwiani containing "Pure Kiwi Air" goes for \$65.

Remember how normal people laughed when liberals started pushing bottled water? It seemed so ridiculous that health nuts would pay for something that came free out of every faucet in every building in the country. But to lefties, bottled water proved one's superior consciousness. And pretty soon, everyone had stashes of bottled water. In 2015, the last year for which the Centers for Disease control reports data, fewer abortions per 1,000 women were performed in the United States than at any time since 1973. That's when, in *Roe v. Wade*, the Supreme Court ruled that states could not ban the practice. It may be a reflection of the public's increased sensitivity to the morally troubling nature of abortion that it is being performed not only at a lower rate but, on average, earlier in pregnancy and gestation. ## TO NOT CATCH A THIEF

When it comes to crime, Brits are on their own – because law enforcement has basically given bandits a license to steal. As reported by *The [UK] Daily Mail*, Norfolk police in East Anglia are using a *computer algorithm* to determine whether it's "worthwhile" to investigate home burglaries.

I am not making this up. Victims of home break-ins have to write their own statements and provide their own evidence with home cams. But if the algorithm determines that the chances of finding the culprit are low, the police simply close the case.

In 2018, the Norfolk Constabulary has ended hundreds of investigations this way. From March to September, only 5 of 99 recent break-ins led to suspects being charged. And here's a shocker, burglaries have increased ten percent.

So, what do you get when you add high tech to the UK's socialism? The same thing you get with low-tech socialism: crime pays. (*Limbaugh Letter*)

A new study of California's Medicaid expansion –which, like all of Obamacare's Medicaid expansions, is funded overwhelmingly with federal rather than state dollars - makes one thing clear: It's awfully nice to get "free" money from the national government. These dollars replaced money that county governments had already been spending on health care for the poor, and they made hospitals more profitable. They also, it must be said, made it easier for the poor to access care and to go to private instead of government-run hospitals. But any reduction to in-hospital mortality was small enough that it couldn't be measured reliably, which is consistent with other studies showing that the health benefits of receiving Medicaid are, at best, small and inconsistent. The system we have today, in which states can choose to expand a poorly functioning health-care program and federal taxpayers are stuck with 90 percent of the tab or more, is insane. But the GOP failed to overhaul it when it had the reins of power over the last two years, so we are stuck with it for at least two more. (National Review)

## PECKING DISORDER

It probably looked like a way to kill two birds with one stone. Reuters headlined its story, "Woodpeckers Show Signs of Potential Brain Damage." Boston University [BU] neuropathologist and youth football coach Peter Cummings conducted a study on woodpeckers because "we've designed . . . football helmets based on the biomechanics of the woodpecker, but no one had ever looked at a woodpecker brain." Well, knock me over with a feather. Here would come new proof that constant head pounding – in a birdbrain or an NFL linebacker – leads to brain damage. Woody Woodpecker as the poster bird for the dangers of youth football would inevitably follow.

But leftist hopes were dashed. The BU researchers found that while woodpeckers furiously pound on tree bark at a force of up to 1,400 Gs (for comparison, human concussions can result from 60 to 100 Gs), the birds show little or no damage from it. Researchers did find a buildup of the protein *tau* in woodpecker brains "that in people is associated with brain damage" from head trauma. But in the birds' case, the protein appears protective. So claiming woodpeckers suffer from "trauma-related neurodegenerative disease" is barking up the wrong tree. After all, notes Cummings, the peckers "have been in existence for millions of years and are thriving." . . . (*Limbaugh Letter*)

Bowing to activist pressure, the American Academy of Pediatrics released an official policy statement on how to ensure "comprehensive care and support for transgender and gender diverse children and adolescents" that involves affirming "transgender" identity in any young person who declares one, then setting him along the path to transition. The AAP is composed of 67,000 pediatricians, but in reality only around 36 voted on this policy. Though the radicals may be a minority, some pediatricians are afraid to voice their opposition for fear of reputational destruction (e.g., "Transphobe!"). One member told *National Review* that the AAP is in continual danger of politicization from the far Left. In 2010, for instance, the AAP released a policy statement endorsing certain types of female genital cutting and stating that, "above all," pediatricians should be culturally sensitive to Islamic customs. After backlash from feminists and human-rights groups, however, the AAP was forced to rescind this policy. The struggle for a consistent position on mutilation continues. (National Review)
