WHAT TO EXPECT AT THE 2020 PRECINCT MEETINGS AND COUNTY CONVENTION

Many of our newer members may not be aware of the significance of the upcoming Precinct Mass Meetings and County Convention set for Saturday, **March 21, 2020** at the winder Lions Club, 354 E. Broad St.

At 9:00 AM on March 21, 2020, Precinct Chairpersons or Temporary Precinct Meeting Chairpersons will call the 16 individual precinct meetings to order. All participants at these meetings must be duly registered in accordance with State Republican Party rules and Georgia State election Code. Precincts without Chairpersons will elect these officers. All Precinct Chairpersons will then conduct the rest of the precinct meetings. Each precinct meeting will elect Delegates and alternates to the 2020 Barrow County Republican Convention. All Delegates will receive name tags for Convention usage.

When all of this is completed, the paperwork (in triplicate) will be processed and routed to the appropriate local Party representatives. Other precinct business may take place at this meeting.

At 10:00 AM on **March 21**, the current local Party Chairman Debbie Reid will call the 2020 County Convention to order. After the Pledge of Allegiance, Invocation, Presentation of the

State Call, and introduction of Dignitaries, Convention committees will be appointed and dismissed to conduct their work (Credentials, Nominations). During this time, there will be announcements and speeches in the convention hall.

After the Convention committees return and report, the Convention will then elect Delegates and Alternates to the 10th U.S. Congressional District Republican Convention to be held on Saturday, **April 18, 2020**, in Marswood Hall, Watkinsville, Georgia. Delegates and Alternates will also be elected to the State Republican Convention to be held on Friday and Saturday, **May 29-30. 2020**, in Marietta, Cobb County, Georgia.

At the District/State Conventions, Delegates and Alternates will be elected to the Republican National Convention, Monday through Thursday, **August 24-27**, **2020**, in Charlotte, North Carolina, to nominate the next Republican President.

CIVIL WAR: HOW DO CIVIL WARS HAPPEN?

Two or more sides disagree on who runs the country. And they can't settle the question through elections because they don't even agree that elections are how you decide who's in charge. That's the basic issue here. Who decides who runs the country? When you hate each other but accept the elections results, you have a country. When you stop accepting election results, you have a countdown to a civil war.

The Mueller investigation is about removing President Trump from office and overturning the results of an election. We all know that. But it's not the first time they've done this. The first time a Republican President was elected this century, they said he didn't really win. The Supreme Court gave him the election. There's a pattern here.

What do sure odds of the Democrats rejecting the next Republican President really mean? It means they don't accept the results of any election that they don't win. It means they don't believe that transfers of power in this country are determined by elections. That's a civil war.

There's no shooting. At least not unless you count the attempt to kill a bunch of Republicans at a charity baseball game practice. But the Democrats have rejected our system of government.

This isn't dissent. It's not disagreement. You can hate the other party. You can think they're the worst thing that ever happened to the country. But then you work harder to win the next election. When you consistently reject the results of elections that you don't win, what you want is a dictatorship.

Your very own dictatorship.

The only legitimate exercise of power in this country, according to Democrats, is its own. Whenever Republicans exercise power, it's inherently illegitimate. The Democrats lost Congress. They lost the White House. So what did they do? They began trying to run the country through Federal judges and bureaucrats. Every time that a Federal judge issues an order saying that the President of the United States can't scratch his own back without his say so, that's the civil war.

Our system of government is based on the Constitution, but that's not the system that runs this country. The Democrat's system is that any part of government that it runs gets total and unlimited power over the country.

If the Democrats are in the White House, then the President can do anything. And I mean anything. He can have his own amnesty for illegal aliens. He can fine you for not having health insurance. He can use the IRS as his own police force and imprison citizens who speak against him. He can provide guns and money (Fast and Furious, Iran nuclear deal) to other countries to support his own agenda, and watch while one of America's Ambassadors is dragged through the streets and murdered doing nothing to aid our citizens. His power is unlimited. He's a dictator.

But when Republicans get into the White House, suddenly the President can't do anything. He isn't allowed to undo the illegal alien amnesty that his predecessor illegally invented. Donald Trump has caused the Shadow Government to come out of hiding: Professional government is a guild. Like medieval guilds. You can't serve in if you're not a member. If you haven't been indoctrinated into its arcane rituals. If you aren't in the club. And Trump isn't in the club. He brought in a bunch of people who aren't in the club with him.

Now we're seeing what the pros do when amateurs try to walk in on them. They spy on them, they investigate them and they send them to jail. They use the tools of power to bring them down.

That's not a free country.

It's not a free country when FBI agents who support Hillary take out an "insurance policy" against Trump winning the election. It's not a free country when Obama officials engage in massive unmasking of the opposition. It's not a free country when the media responds to the other guy winning by trying to ban the conservative media that supported him from social media. It's not a free country when all of the above collude together to overturn an election because the guy wasn't supposed to win did.

Have no doubt, we're in a civil war between conservative volunteer government and a leftist Democrat professional government.

Well now Pilgrims and Patriots, having read the above I suggest two things: forward this very timely, very important analysis to those whom you believe think like you do and <u>make sure you vote on every Election Day!</u>

An Ohio jury has reached a verdict that should send a shock wave through college administrations across the land. It has ordered Oberlin College to pay \$11 million in compensatory damages and \$33 million in punitive damages for its employees' role in accusing a local, family-owned grocery store and bakery of racism and racial profiling. The facts of the case are egregious but not surprising, given modern campus culture. After police arrested three Oberlin students for shoplifting alcohol and assaulting a store employee who had tried to stop the theft, student activists launched protests against the bakery, claiming the store's shoplifting accusation was racially motivated. Administrators provided direct support to student protestors and even participated in the protests by distributing a defamatory flyer to the media, among other ways. The college also engaged in economic reprisals against the bakery by canceling a longstanding food-service relationship. In other words, without waiting for the facts, administrators participated in a campaign of defamation, wrongly harming the family's business and damaging their reputation. But the First Amendment does not give anyone license to lie, especially if the target of the lie isn't a public official. Oberlin may be full of students and administrators who consider themselves woke, but it was the jury that spoke truth to power. (National Review)

HOOD RATS

To appease the environmental wackos, car companies have been making automotive parts like wire coatings out of "sustainable" materials – like soy or cannabis. Because they're "renewable." Problem is, "renewable" equals "edible." According to *The Detroit Free Press*, car owners are now throwing money down a rathole to fix hundreds of dollars' worth of damage after rats and other vermin sampled the all-you-can-eat buffet under their hoods.

Los Angeles attorney Brian Kabateck filed a class-action lawsuit against Toyota on behalf of a customer who had the soy-based insulated wiring in his Tundra destroyed by rodents three times. AAA Mid-Atlantic spokesperson Tracy Noble acknowledged, "While advances in car construction can be beneficial to the environment, there may also be unforeseen consequences such as making your care more appetizing to rodents." Republicans led by Senators Josh Hawley of Missouri and Marsha Blackburn of Tennessee have introduced legislation that would relocate the great majority of federal workers in ten cabinet-level departments from the District of Columbia to other parts of the country. The legislatively forced exodus would be intended to have two effects: to bring high-paying federal jobs and the economic activity that goes with them to less robustly flourishing parts of the country, and to reduce the concentration of government interests in Washington and thereby counteract the capital city's increasing centrality in American life. This would constitute the amplification of a minor trend already under way, e.g. with the relocation of the Bureau of Land Management to Grand Junction, Colo., and the Department of Agriculture's moving some facilities to Kansas City. The same bill would ask the Office of Management and Budget to consider departmental mergers and restructuring. It is a little funny to hear Republicans talking about all the good a bigger government payroll can do for the local economy, but the proposal here is fundamentally sound. The American Federation of Government Employees is of course already complaining that the move would not be cost-effective or practical. Remember decades ago, when I used to make fun of stoner "frog lickers"? I always wondered what idiot first decided to pick up a frog and lick it to see what would happen. Well, they're back. The hallucinogenic Colorado River Toads are now a hot trend in stupid parts of New York, according to *The New York Post*. But instead of licking the toads' venom glands, wealthy New Yorkers attend bizarre shaman-led "ceremonies" to inhale the rare and costly amphibian resin through glass stem pipes.

One fan is "social-media influencer and life coach" Barrett Pall, who has taken a few rides on the magic toad by hiring a Mexican shaman who charges up to \$500 per person. As the drug "leaves users immobile and unaware, and can cause extreme emotional reactions, euphoria and vomiting." Pall says it should not be done at a party. No kidding, Sherlock.
